Important Dates:

Application Period: Monday, January 15th – Monday, January 29th

Dates of Internship: May 22 – August 11, 2006

Requirements:

Applicants must be enrolled in either the B.S. in Computer Science or Bachelor of Information Technology or M.S. in Computer Science degree program both at the time of application and at the time that the internship will be served;

and

Applicants must be a senior or graduate student with a minimum grade point average of 2.65. To qualify as a senior, applicants must have completed 135 quarter hours or 90 semester hours of a baccalaureate program, but not be granted a degree by the date the intern session will end; and

Every applicant must be in the upper third of her/his class in academic standing; and

Applicants must be citizens of the United States of America.

Additional Information:

Selection is highly competitive, and is based upon: grade point averages, both in the applicant's major and overall; leadership and community participation; work experiences; professional experiences related to the applicant's major; the contents and communication skills reflected in the applicant's narrative essay; the contents of the submitted Intern Nomination form; and, if the applicant successfully makes it through the initial selection process, the responses given during a telephonic interview.

There will be no discrimination in qualifying, certifying, ranking or selection because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, political affiliations, marital status, physical handicap, age, or membership or non-membership in an employee organization. All intern applicants must be citizens of the United States.

Intern Benefits:

In addition to access to FLETC's training and recreational opportunities, interns receive \$39 per session day of taxable income to help defray the cost of meals, incidental expenses, and travel costs. **Interns are required** to live on the FLETC facility in a dormitory at no cost.

To Apply:

1. Prepare a current resume,
2. Develop an accompanying Narrative Essay that sets forth, at a minimum, the following information: why you are interested in the FLETC College Intern Program; your career motivation and goals; the source or inspiration for your career motivation and goals; your knowledge of the function of the FLETC College Intern Program; the skills that you would bring to FLETC if you were selected as an intern; and the FLETC Division or Partner Organization where you would like to be placed during the Internship Session;
3. Official college transcript(s) – from all colleges attended, pursuing baccalaureate and graduate degrees, showing class rank;
4. Pre-screening will be conducted by Mr. Randy Grubb, Director of Armstrong Atlantic State University's Homeland and Cyber Security Institute. If you are selected as a finalist for the position, additional paperwork will be required by FLETC.
